#### 助產士:母嬰健康的基石

Midwifery is the answer



塞拉利昂是全球孕產婦死亡率最高的國家之一。為提升母嬰存活率,政府銳意增加助產士人手,全因相對於醫生,培訓助產士的時間和財政成本較低。UNICEF一向支持塞拉利昂政府提升醫療體系績效,包括培訓助產士。預計該國合格助產士人數將從2010年的57人增加到2025年的3,500人。

The maternal mortality rate in Sierra Leone is among the highest in the world. To improve survival rates of mothers and babies, midwifery was identified as the optimal solution – it takes less time and money to train a midwife than a medical doctor. UNICEF has been providing capacity development support to Sierra Leone, including the training of midwives. The number of midwives is expected to increase from 57 in 2010 to 3,500 by 2025.

New life amidst conflict



在也門,近一半醫療設施因武裝衝突而被摧毀,無數醫護人員更被迫逃離家園。因此,只有四分一孕婦有機會接受產前檢查,過半數婦女未能在合格助產士的照料下分娩。有見及此,UNICEF與伙伴合作,成功保持該國六成的基本醫療服務,同時支援七千名社區助產士。

In Yemen, almost half of the healthcare facilities were destroyed due to armed conflict, not to mention the healthcare workers who were forced to flee the country. As a result, only 25% of pregnant women were able to receive prenatal care and less than half of the mothers delivered with a skilled birth attendant. To address this issue, UNICEF works with partners to maintain 60% of basic healthcare services, while supporting 7,000 community midwives.
